

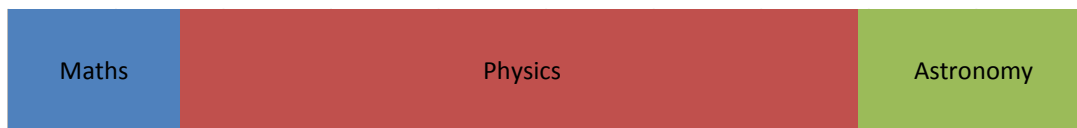

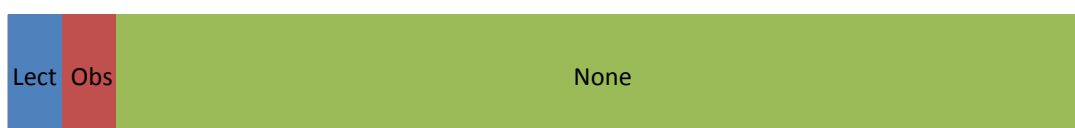

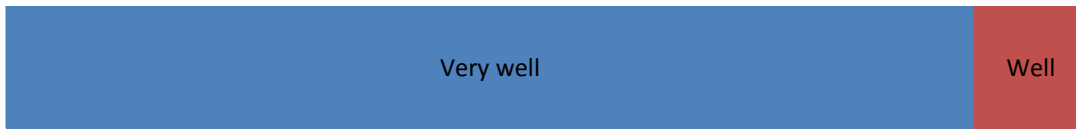

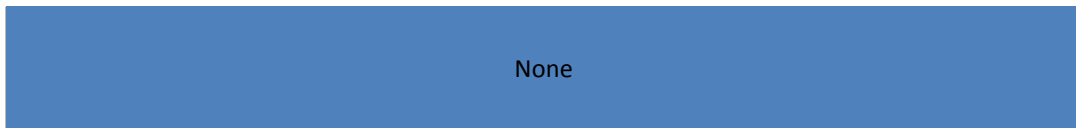
The subjects, have met your expectations?

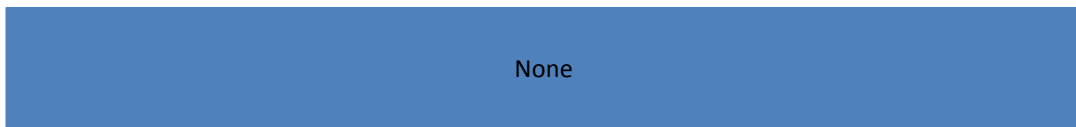

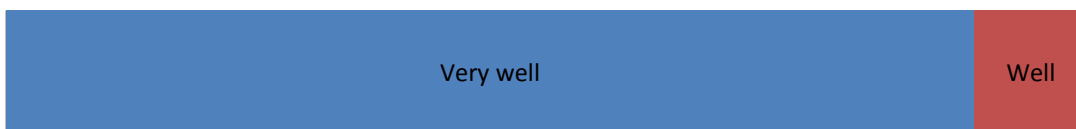
The level of activities has been:

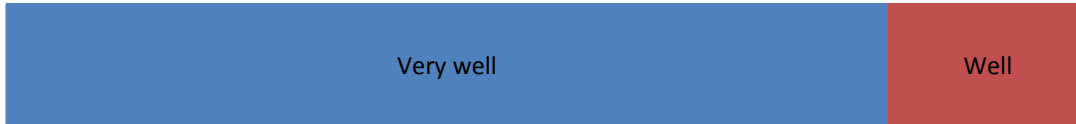
What is your opinion about the teaching methods of teachers?

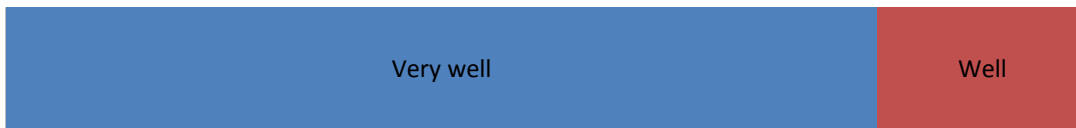
What is your opinion about the CD that you received at the beginning of the school?

What is your opinion about the visit session astronomical?

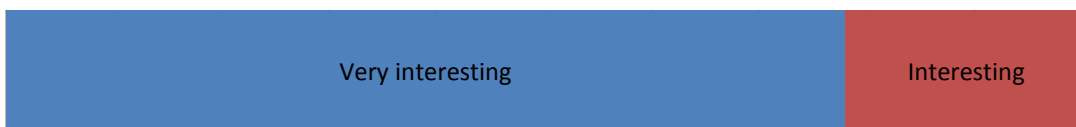

What is your overall opinion of the course related to:

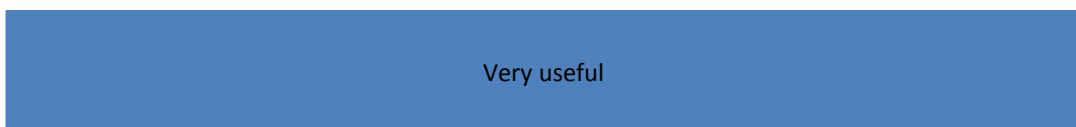
a) Exchanges and contacts with other participants?
